### The 37th Annual Conference – Berwick-upon-Tweed Friday 23rd September 2022 to Sunday 25h September 2022

Dear Fellow Members,

Berwick-upon-Tweed invites us for our 37th Annual Weekend.

Berwick was described by Pevsner as "the most exciting little town in England". It includes the only part of England north of the River Tweed (4 sq. miles). The Guildhall is 2 miles south of the Scottish border.

In 1296 Edward 1 used the land to build stonewalls so that he could cross the border at low tide. Only Jerusalem has been besieged more times than Berwick, which changed hands 13 times, before coming under permanent English control in 1492. It is not to be confused with North Berwick which is definitely in Scotland.

Elizabeth 1 transformed the walls, spending twice the defence budget for the whole of her reign, to stop Scotland and Feance attacking England from the North.

The Railway Station was built over the 13th Century castle and stones from the Castle were used to build the Parish Church during the rule of Oliver Cromwell.

In the past, Berwick was a trading post for salmon, grain, linen, eggs and herring and was also a base for arctic whalers.

The town has museum, art galleries, an 18th century army barracks and the walls and shops and restaurants.

Berwick's Shrievalty in its present form dates from 1836. The ancient Shrievalty dates from 1147 and was an hereditary post including John de Soulis in 1288 (who was also Vicar of Berwick) and the Earls of Bothwell. That Shrievalty area also encompassed Berwickshire which is now part of Scotland.
